As I began my tenure as Executive Director in July 2015, I was quite aware that I had very big shoes to fill! Ed Morgan's leadership, as a board member for 5 years, and more recently as Executive Director for 2 years, has been instrumental in transforming Friends of PEB's (FOPEB) financial and structural stability and helping to significantly raise the level of support for PEB here in the U.S. Through the strong efforts of Ed, the Board of Directors, Veda Gill and Lynn Miller, FOPEB has become a professional and effective 501(c)(3) non-profit organization, raising over \$1,000,000 in 2015. These funds are helping to transform the schools and students at the PEB schools.

There is much to celebrate in 2015! Students are studying in new classrooms in Martinpur. Construction has begun for a desperately needed new dormitory for the Christian girls from remote villages studying in Sargodha. Funds were given to complete the entire infrastructure of Sangla Hill Girls School. A record number of scholarships were provided.

Still I am overwhelmed by the needs each time I visit Pakistan. The quality of education offered by the government is abysmal. Extreme poverty prevents most parents from the ability to afford private education. Many more scholarships are desperately needed for PEB to fulfill their commitment for ALL students to have the opportunity for a high quality education. Several 100-year-old crumbling buildings still need to be replaced to provide a safe learning environment.

I am optimistic that FOPEB will continue to build on our strong foundation to help support and grow the important ministry of PEB. I welcome our new Director of Communications, Jamie Williams who will be helping FOPEB communicate with you in fresh new ways via print, internet, and social media. I also welcome two new Board members, Stuart Baskin and Tim Roach who both bring extensive non-profit experience, and expand our reach to the southwest and northwest areas of the U.S.

I want to thank YOU – our new and old friends – for being important partners in PEB's ministry. Your encouragement, prayers and financial support are helping PEB to bring hope and a bright future to children in Pakistan!

A Legacy Rekindled...

The story of my great-grandparents and their missionary life was almost a legend in my family. The "big picture" is that my ancestors, The Rev. Dr. Samuel and Lydia Martin preached and worked as Presbyterian missionaries to convert residents of Punjab to Christianity. A Christian village was established in 1898 and named for them - Martinpur (village of Martin in Urdu). That's about all we knew growing up.

In the last couple years, through Veda Gill of PEB, we learned that yes, there is indeed a village named Martinpur and that PEB administers two schools there. This started a conversation within my extended family (a total of 11 cousins) which led to establishing an endowed scholarship fund for students of the Martinpur schools. The Samuel & Lydia Martin Memorial Scholarship Fund at the Presbyterian Foundation currently funds 4 annual student scholarships with the funds flowing through Friends of PEB to Pakistan. Our goal is to grow this fund so more scholarships are available over time.

I had the opportunity to personally visit Martinpur this past November. I was so impressed with how much the schools accomplish both academically and with extracurricular activities. I also saw how poor the village is and came away more convinced than ever of the value of the endowed scholarships. What my family is doing now is nothing compared to the accomplishments of our great-grandparents but it is our contribution to keeping their mission and vision alive.






